## Jeffery Murphy

**P**ITTSBURG, KS – Jeffery Murphy, 51, of Pittsburg, died March 4, 2017 at Freeman West Hospital in Joplin, MO.

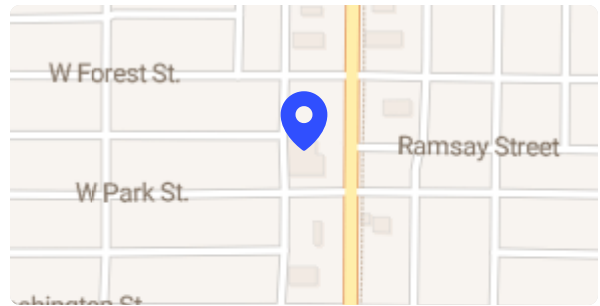

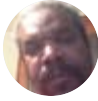
